Dear Mr. Dys:

Thank you for bringing this important issue to our attention. Somerset Academy of Las Vegas is dedicated to providing an equitable, high-quality education for all its students.

We respect the civil liberties of our students and their parents. As such, we strive to comply with the directives set forth by the U.S. Department of Education (DOE), including those dealing with religious expression in public schools. We endeavor to strike the correct balance between two basic and equally important obligations imposed on public school officials by the First Amendment: honoring the students' right to express their personal religious views, while not endorsing any particular religious activity or doctrine. Balancing these interests is not an easy task, and "will depend on specific factual contexts and will require careful consideration in particular cases." (DOE, *Religious Expression in Public Schools: A Statement of Principles*, 1998).

The teacher and assistant principal in this matter acted in good faith at all times and intended to follow DOE's guidelines. After reviewing the facts of this particular situation, Somerset Academy recognizes that the teacher and assistant principal incorrectly implemented those guidelines. Expression of a student's religious beliefs in the form of homework, artwork,

and other written or oral assignments is protected speech and should have been allowed in this instance.

Somerset Academy of Las Vegas and its Administrators apologize for this inadvertent error. The student will be allowed to re-submit her original presentation, inclusive of her religious beliefs. Additionally, we are taking active steps to make sure that the DOE guidelines are properly implemented by Somerset's administration and teachers.
